Document Description: How to map a network drive using Macintosh OSX.

Quick Start:

- 1) *In the Finder, select "Go" → "Connect to Server"*
- 2) *Enter the protocol and path of the share drive (e.g. smb://server/share)*
- 3) *Enter login name and password*

1. Background

This document details how to map a network drive. The example used in this case is a personal network drive on the ICT Server called "Tango". All UniKey account holders have an account on tango, and thus have access to map this network drive.

You may also have been given access to other network drives. These can be mapped using a similar procedure by replacing the server and share drive names with those of the network drive which you are trying to access.





2. Mapping a Network Drive


Action/Outcome	Reference
<p>In the Finder, click on "Go" on the toolbar and select "Connect to Server".</p>	
<p>In the box labelled "Server Address", enter the protocol and address to connect to the server. In order to connect to your personal network drive on tango enter the following, replacing "UniKey" with your UniKey login name:</p> <p>smb://tango.ucc.usyd.edu.au/UniKey</p> <p>Click on the  button to add this server to your list of favorites.</p> <p>and click "Connect".</p> <p>(This method can also be used to connect to other network drives, using the appropriate protocol and server/share address, common protocols are smb and afp)</p>

<p>In the field marked "Name", enter your UniKey login name.</p> <p>In the field marked "Password", enter your UniKey password.</p> <p>Click "OK"</p> <p>A window containing the contents of your network drive will appear.
